Science/Hipps:

"Whats A Matta U"

We are still dealing with matter and will be for the next two weeks. As you are already know, our first matter test was moved to Tuesday (10/8). Please make sure your student plays the practice Quizzez game on the website. Going over elements, compounds, molecules, and atoms will be especially helpful.

Throughout the rest of Matter, we will continue focusing upon phase changes. Students will now have to understand evaporation and condensation more on the molecular level. In other words, it is the movement of molecules that determine the state of matter.

This final section on matter is the most difficult because of unfamiliar terms like solute, solvent, solution, and suspension. Especially confusing to students are the terms dilute and concentrated. Although they seem like terms that students should be familiar with, many have no experience using them. Perhaps students should make Kool Aide and practice at home making it dilute, then concentrated!
